Land Management

Cummings Lumber Company, Inc.'s forestry staff helps land owners establish and accomplish their long term recreational goals and financial objectives. A forester discusses with the landowner the history of the woods, how the land is being used, the number of acres involved and the property boundary lines. He handles necessary permits and provides maps with the harvesting procedures detailed. He marks, measures and evaluates the timber and provides the land owner with a contract, a timber management plan of the trees to be harvested, and their value.

Harvesting Preparation

Site preparation for the harvest begins when the landing site, truck roads and skid trails, if needed, are graded in. Soil disturbance is kept to a minimum with an allowance for adequate ditching and cross drainage. The site is then organized to accommodate sorting, processing and short-term storage of timber and designed to allow for safe movement of the workers and equipment.

Harvesting Techniques

The harvesting begins with careful directional felling of the marked trees to minimize damage to the standing timber and position the trees properly for removal. Branches are lopped off and left in the woods to break down and return back to the soil. Logs are then transported to the landing site and stacked until they are trucked to the mill.

Following The Harvest

When the harvesting has been completed, roads are smoothed and leveled, the landing is cleared of all debris and grass seed is planted in disturbed areas if needed. In most cases natural vegetation establishes itself in just a few months. Lands maintained as open areas can provide recreation and a source of food and cover for many forms of wildlife and can be reused for future logging with minimal cost and work.

Timber Management



If you have timber on your property, you are the owner(s) and steward(s) of a very valuable resource which can either produce one quick monetary return with little chance for any additional return in your lifetime, or through careful management you may produce several substantial monetary returns in the same time span. In addition you are creating and maintaining a valuable asset for you and your heirs. Timber is a Renewable Resource that should be Managed Properly.

Perhaps one of the best analogies for your wood lot is your own personal garden. They both are crops, but one matures in about eighty days and the other in about eighty years. When one of your tomatoes ripens, you don't run out and pick all of them. Conversely, you do not wait until they all ripen, before you pick any. Instead you pick on only the ripe ones and at the same time remove any deformed or rotten ones.

In essence we apply the same idea to Timber Harvesting. In the forest industry we term this type of harvest a select cut or a timber stand improvement (TSI). A diameter cut (e.g. all trees 14" DBH & up may be cut) may have been suggested to you but that is quite similar to the idea of picking all the tomatoes when one is ripe. Also the deformed and diseased trees will normally not be removed thus leaving you with an extremely understocked and poor quality stand of trees.
